

2) Service to Community, Social responsibility and Welfare measures.

The College extends its infrastructure facilities to various organisations such as Indian Medical Association - Narasapur Branch, Sri Ramakrishna Seva Samithi, Narasapur Pyramid Spiritual Society, Private Medical Practitioners Association, Senior Citizens Association and Lions Clubs of Narasapur that are engaged in community service. Government agencies like the Revenue Department and the Municipal authorities utilize the College facilities including the Computer Labs during their major external activities such as census, surveys and elections. Narasapur is on the banks of river Godavari, close to Bay of Bengal and hence its surroundings are prone to floods and cyclones. Whenever such calamities take place the buildings and the facilities are made use of to provide shelter to the victims or evacuated population. The vast play ground inside the College campus is utilised by general public for their morning and evening walks and the various courts provide opportunity for many of them to even play games such as Shuttle badminton, Volley Ball and Foot Ball. The College Management is known for its Staff Welfare measures. The College Auditorium is given free of cost to all the employees for family functions. All the staff members and families are given free medical consultation by the Secretary and Correspondent who himself is the senior most Doctor in the Town. Leave applied for prolonged periods on medical grounds is always considered as paid leave irrespective of the duration to all the staff. Financial assistance is given to Physically Handicapped Students and bicycles are given to girl students to commute from their villages. As a social responsibility the College has adopted two major slums that are adjacent to its Campus and carries out community service through its NSS units and Community Service Centre regularly. The College has devised a scheme "Swayam Krushi" wherein women from the adopted slums are trained in sewing & embroidery. At the end of the Training, they are given sewing machines to earn a livelihood. HRD centre extends its services to the unemployed youth in and around Narsapur by conducting job oriented training programmes. It also organizes Job Melas meant for our College students and unemployed youth from the rural areas. All its services are free of charge for youth from local as well as surrounding rural areas. Women empowerment cell organizes free self defence training programmes for girls and women belonging to the surrounding rural areas. NSS Volunteers offer services on call and regularly during all Natural Calamities and all special occasions like festivals at local Bondamma old age Home for destitute women and Kalyani School for Mental Rehabilitation. Free Medical Camps and hygiene campaigns

are routinely conducted by the Community Service Centre of the College for the public besides rescue and welfare activities during natural calamities. The College also has established an R O Water plant to cater to the needs of the nearby slum areas.
