



XIX. Observations of the Committee

The College has well equipped spacious HRD Centre which is receiving regular funding from various external sources to organize several programs for enhancing student personality, employability skills and soft skills etc.

Campus interviews and campus drives are being organized, however it needs to be intensified for providing more placement chances to the college students and others including common public.

The facilities in some of the laboratories are good and are being used for enhancing practical skills of the students.

The students are well disciplined and are adhering to the rules and regulations properly. The campus is neat and clean and the greenery of the campus is well maintained.

The college has a good Community Centre, through this the community oriented activities are being taken up regularly.

The college displays nice quotations of great personalities which could inculcate moral values and focus on determined goals and aims and motivate the students to walk in a right path. The Department of English has a well equipped language laboratory with self-explanatory software which are being used for enhancing the linguistic skills of students of all departments.

The college has three Hi-tech class rooms with videoconference facility which needs to be used extensively by the faculty members to enhance skills of students and to make them learn intensively.

Courses viz., B.Voc. - Health Care & Nursing and B.Voc. - Fashion Technology & Apparel Designing are popular and attracting matured students as well.

The College has a good library building with good number of books, however there is a need to procure latest publications in all subjects.

XX. Suggestions of the Committee

As the campus has large land area the rainwater harvesting needs to be intensified wherever possible and also need to enhance the harvesting of solar energy systems.

Efforts should be put to make application for NIRF ranking to get successful outcome.
